Packet in Lapeer County

We now have two club packet stations running 24 / 7 in Lapeer County.

At the repeater site on 145.03 MHz

- MYCALL: W8LAP-2
- PBBS: W8LAP-4
- NODE: LCARA

At the EOC club meeting site on 145.09 MHz

- MYCALL: W8LAP-1
- PBBS: W8LAP-3
- NODE: EOC44

The 145.03 MHz frequency seems to be the frequency where you will find most local stations. I don't know the reason for this choice but it is the local one.

The 145.09 Mhz frequency is considered the "EMCOM" frequency. It is the same frequency that the Genesee County EOC operates on. Also, the 44 in the node name is the Lapeer County number - I'm guessing it is assigned by the state.

Please feel free to use both the PBBS and NODE functions at either site.

Lapeer County ARES Net Preamble

Calling all amateurs to the Tuesday / Thursday Lapeer County ARES net (unkey and pause).

Good evening and welcome to the **Tuesday / Thursday** Lapeer County ARES net. This net meets every **Tuesday / Thursday** night at 8:00 pm local time on the W8LAP repeater, located 3 miles east of Lapeer, Michigan. This repeater is owned and operated by the Lapeer County Amateur Radio Association and the repeater trustee is Mike Zedan, KN8Z. The repeater is accessible with a 100 Hz tone.

The purposes of this net are to promote good fellowship among amateur radio operators and to provide training for ARES net activations. Questions are always welcome. This is a directed net and all licensed amateurs are invited and encouraged to participate.

My name is <u>XX</u>, call sign <u>XX</u> and I will be your net control operator for this session. We will now begin with a series of standbys. When checking into the net, please give your call sign and name clearly.

- At this time are there any emergency or priority check-ins for the net? If so, please call now.
- Any mobile or portable stations wishing to check into the net, please call now.
- Any stations with announcements for the net, please call now.
- General check-ins for the net, please call now.

Note that the above order is listed in the priority that the stations should be recognized by net control.

Net control recognizes (list all call signs that checked into the net).

Now begin the rotation of checked in stations.

Every 10 minutes take a standby for additional check-ins and ID yourself.

After the last round is completed:

Are there any new check-ins for the net?

If nothing is heard:

Is there any further business or re-checks for the net?

If nothing is heard:

Hearing nothing, this will now conclude the net for <u>date</u>. The net is now closed at <u>time</u> PM after <u>XX</u> minutes. We had <u>XX</u> check-ins and <u>XX</u> re-checks. I would like to thank everyone for their participation and wish everyone a good evening. I will now return the repeater to normal amateur use.
