I was still driving home from work, talking with my wife on the cell phone (hands-free, of course) when the line went dead. As I got closer to home, things started looking grim. Trees down over the road, power lines down, the whole nine yards. After driving over several trees in my little commuter car, the last mile was impassable, and I ended up hiking back to my house, fearing the worst. The houses in the video above were at the front end of the subdivision; one had been pushed off its foundation. Another had the contents of the garage sucked clean out through the back wall of the garage. A piece of metal downspout, blown free of its home, was wrapped around a tree trunk, sticking out like a tin foil flag. You get the idea. Long story short, we got lucky, and our home escaped damage.

That storm helped me understand something fundamental. By the time you hear about the disaster on the news, it's already happened. But our amateur nets? Those are real-time, with men and women like yourselves, helping others by keeping (pun intended) a weather eye out. It's a major driver for me, and I recommend it to all.

Primary purpose of this network is for amateur radio emergency communication and normal amateur radio communication throughout the network. Hello to all fellow LCARA members.

Well it seems that Skywarn season is almost here if the winter weather would just end. I guess this may be a case of "be careful what you wish for". I would urge all operators that want to participate in the Skywarn nets to brush up on the NWS criteria for reporting. Below is a refresher on what the red, yellow, green status of a Skywarn net means to you the spotter. Please take a moment to review it. This type of information is important to us spotters but is not necessarily covered in the Skywarn training as taught by the NWS.

Please print this out and keep it by your radio throughout this year's weather spotter season.

Type of Alert

Severe Thunderstorm or Tornado Watch

Net is activated Check-ins accepted General weather reports

Severe Thunderstorm Watch or Warning

Net is active

Types of reports to be accepted

- a) Tornadoes (on the ground where, movement, direction, speed, and damage visible)
- b) Funnel clouds (direction, rotation, speed, location)
- c) Wall clouds (direction, rotation, speed, location)
- d) Hail (give diameter)
- e) Flooding (water over the curbs)
- f) Heavy or torrential rains (near zero visibility)
- g) Damaging winds (speed, direction, damage)
- h) Intense, frequent lighting

Tornado Warning Red

- a) Tornadoes (on the ground where, movement, direction, speed, and damage visible)
- b) Funnel clouds (direction, rotation, speed, location)
- c) Wall clouds (direction, rotation, speed, location)

County Condition Code

Green or Standby

Yellow
